### **Message from Melissa**

What a busy first few weeks we have had!

Our whole school has spent time exploring our focus value for this term:

### We act with trust, honesty, integrity and courage

All of the classes have now discussed, decided upon and implemented classroom agreements. These are displayed in classrooms and most classes have shared these via Seesaw. If you are interested in learning more about the agreements in your child/ren's class/es please don't hesitate to speak with their teachers.

Another exciting development in the early part of Term 1 has been classes selecting names. This year staff discussed the importance of classes selecting names for themselves rather than going by titles such as, 'Year 5/6' or 'Jacey's class'. Through this process we aim to embed more ownership of the class for all students and staff within each team. We are also trying to move away from the use of possessive pronouns to describe classes as we know that each class is made of a team and all team members are represented and contribute to the class as a whole.

In line with our Reconciliation Action Plan and embedding Indigenous perspectives in our school, we have decided to choose Nyungar names for our classes. Classes have researched Nyungar words, brainstormed ideas and meanings behind the words, and together have selected names to represent them. Finally, we sought

some guidance from Nyungar Elders regarding spelling and grammar. I am very excited to share our chosen class names with our community!



Welcome back for the new school year to all returning and new families and students to Kerry Street!

As we move forward into 2022, the Board looks a little different due to the resignation of our long-standing Chairperson Tania Ivey, who officially resigned over the summer holidays. If any of the above tasks sounds like a whole lot of fun to you, if you are passionate about Kerry Street and supporting School community, would like to learn more about how the Board and the School operate and help drive the future of the education of our students, the Board would love to hear from you.

Board members are elected at the Annual General Meeting, usually held in May each year, for a term of three (3) years. After an initial induction process, new Board members are encouraged to act in a General Member capacity they learn the ropes and establish any areas of special interest.

### **Family Support**

The Board have been working on ways to support our school community at this time. One of the major effects of the coronavirus situation is the massive impact it has had on the economy and many people have found themselves without work or in other changed financial circumstances. A number of our families have already been directly affected and we know this puts strain on families. The Board would like to stress that any families facing financial hardship are encouraged to let the school know so we can work out a plan with you to ensure that the burden of fees already owing is eased.

We are also aware that the current restrictions to parents entering the school site impact on the ability for families to complete Community Jobs and Kitchen Lunch. The Board has approved a temporary restructure of these levies to ensure families are not adversely affected. For Term 1 2022:

The School Lunch levy (\$100.00 per family) will not be charged.

The contribution requirement for Community Jobs levy will be reduced from 10 hours for Term 1, to 4 hours per family.

Preparing School Lunch will contribute to the 4-hour Community Jobs requirement. Therefore, any family that has completed or will complete a School Lunch, in Term

1, will fill their 4-hour requirement and will not be required to pay the Community Jobs Levy.

### Reconciliation Action Plan Working Group

Two years ago Kerry Street Community School committed to developing and maintaining a Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP). Our RAP aims to support our school community in developing an educational environment that fosters higher levels of knowledge and pride in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories, cultures and contributions. Through our RAP, we commit to strengthening relationships, respect and opportunities in the classroom, around the school and within the community.

Some of our achievements with our RAP so far have been installing the 4 flag poles at the front of the school, planting and maintaining our Bush Tucker Garden, participating in Aboriginal experiences (incursions, excursions, Welcome to Country's, Smoking Ceremonies), celebrating National Reconciliation Week, create a mural with local Aboriginal aspects, and many learning experiences and projects within our classes.

This year our first goal is to republish our RAP, and highlight new priorities for this year. Within our community, there is unique knowledge and valuable experience that we would love to see reflected in the Actions that we commit to in our RAP. Therefore, to ensure our RAP creates meaningful and sustainable change, we would like your support in driving our RAP development and implementation journey.

The RAP Working Group will meet on a termly basis, however, communication and tasks will occur more regularly. Please note that this role is a voluntary position. Participation can be credited towards your families Community Jobs hours.

Our first Reconciliation Action Plan working group meeting will be on Thursday the  $3^{rd}$  March 2022 from 1:30 – 2:30pm online via Zoom.

### **Parking**

Like parking at every school, ours is limited in terms of its availability, making school drop offs and pick ups a bit of a headache from time-to-time. We are aware of the issues our site causes and are investigating options for additional parking.

Please note that parking for school drop off and pick up is located in the Kerry Street car park, or on the vacant lot behind the Wilderness Space. See green areas marked on the map below. Limited additional parking may be available at the Pear Tree Café or there is plenty of space to park at Baker's Square.


Whilst waiting for children, please turn off your engines rather than idling in the carpark. I know that in this warm weather the air con is tempting but our carp park is a busy place and we would like to keep the air clean and fresh. If you are waiting for

your children, feel free to come into the playground from 3:15pm and enjoy the (hopefully) cool breeze.

For your safety and as a courtesy to our neighbours, we ask that you refrain from parking on median strips and street corners, as identified in red in the map below. We are aware of two previous incidences where vehicles have collided with cars parked on the median strip outside the administration building.

We also ask that you are mindful of our neighbours by **not parking in or blocking access to driveways of adjacent homes.** Please note that under Cockburn City Council regulations "If you are parking or stopping on the verge of a home that isn't yours, you must first obtain permission from the adjoining landowner."

Please be aware that you may be fined for parking illegally, we have had rangers visit our area at drop off and pick up times.
