#### **Incursions Galore!**

This week we were incredibly lucky to be visited by City of Cockburn Rangers Kylie and Janine, along with the Council's resident safety training dog, Ranger Annie, who spoke to us about Dog Safety.

Students from each class learnt about safe dog handling, how to safely approach dogs, how to identify dogs deemed 'dangerous', the role of a ranger, how rangers catch dogs safely and council rules regarding dog ownership.

We enjoyed hearing from and speaking to Ranger Kylie and Janine, and of course loved meeting and petting Ranger Annie.

Thank you to the City of Cockburn for providing these information sessions. Both students and staff left the sessions with new learnings. We hope that the skills we learnt will support us all in approaching and caring for dogs safely.





Last week The Living Soil expo came to Kerry Street! Angela Rossen, a local scientist, and art guru came to our school to share her wisdom of science and art whilst exploring the micro-organisms in our soils!

We found springtails, worm eggs, earwigs and so much more! Students were encouraged to bring a soil sample from home to explore, and we also found samples from around our school.

Students were also given the opportunity to look at the microorganisms in closer detail through sketches and diagrams. They took a moment to look through all the pictures, and then had a go at drawing their own!

Thank you, Angela, for teaching us about the soil within our community. We learnt how to identify and promote healthy soil!




**Drama Production**

All adults attending camp will require a current Working with Children's Check, if you need assistance with this, please contact Linda.



We are super excited to have won a 'Bike Safety Check' session, thanks to the Term 2, Super Boost for 2022!

We were eligible to apply for Super Boost, after jumping right into the 'Your Move' program this year and submitting our Start of Year Hands Up Survey and achieving a Bronze Accreditation in Term 1.

On Tuesday the 2<sup>nd</sup> of August, next term, at no cost to our school, we will have a team of bike mechanics set up for a full day at Kerry Street, to provide comprehensive safety checks and basic bike services. The mechanics will also provide advice on any additional repairs required or replacement parts needed.

This is such a great Your Move program to receive, as it helps to ensure the safety of the bikes our students are using on their journey to and from school. It is also great timing to get the students' bikes checked just before going on camp!

Please click on the following link to sign up to have your child's bike checked. As it takes approximately 20 minutes to service and check each bike, there is a limit of 30 bikes, so please ensure you register your child's bike, if you would like it checked. Spots will be given on a first come first serve basis. I will send out a confirmation email the beginning of next term if you have been successful in securing a place.
