Some more exciting news is the installation of our brand new fence in the playground area. This project was completed over the holidays and the end result is stunning.

Updating the fencing has been a long term goal for the school based on community feedback. In the past we have received feedback that the chain-link fencing misrepresents the school and many have thought we were a day care center. Furthermore, the chain-link fencing posed a risk in the Early Childhood space as it can be climbed by students.

A huge thank you to Taylah who coordinated the entire project, it took many hours of planning and organising, and it was all absolutely worth it to see the space as it is now!. Students from Kaarla Mia took charge of this project, making it a focused class Inquiry. Students engaged with Measurement concepts measuring and mapping the space. They then created designs for the laser cut gates which were

shared with, and voted on, by all students and staff. Make sure you take a look at the beautiful gates initially designed by Mimi Jones and digitally edited by Taylah. Thank you also to Perth Welldone Fencing who completed the job in record timing and worked so closely with the school to imagine our design.

In order to keep fees low and to foster a sense of belonging at Kerry Street, families are responsible for contributing skills, expertise, and time.

Remember, you can always pay the levy if you are unable to participate, though taking on a job is a great way to get to know the school and to feel part of it.

Types of jobs include:

We also have three new practicum students joining us from Notre Dame this term.




In Bindi-bindi Mia we welcome Devin Meadows-Musham:

We are super excited to have won a 'Bike Safety Check' session, thanks to the Term 2, Super Boost for 2022!

We were eligible to apply for Super Boost, after jumping right into the 'Your Move' program this year and submitting our Start of Year Hands Up Survey and achieving a Bronze Accreditation in Term 1.

On Tuesday the 2nd of August, next term, at no cost to our school, we will have a team of bike mechanics set up for a full day at Kerry Street, to provide comprehensive safety checks and basic bike services. The mechanics will also provide advice on any additional repairs required or replacement parts needed.

This is such a great Your Move program to receive, as it helps to ensure the safety of the bikes our students are using on their journey to and from school. It is also great timing to get the students' bikes checked just before going on camp!
