My apologies that this newsletter is coming to you later than normal, things got very busy last week with the lead up to Open Day!

Open Day was a huge success! Despite the weather we had approximately 300 attendees, about 100 of these were visitors. Furthermore we had over 20 families request to book in for a tour.

The school was looking its absolute best. The classrooms were stunning and exhibited displays of engaging and meaningful learning. The library and dining room were gorgeous with lovely personal touches including family portraits, lighting and a Book Week display. The Hall showcased our commitment to the Arts and shared current projects. The grounds looked incredible and our new installments - the fence and sensory pathway look wonderful.

















It was beautiful to see student learning at its best with each class selling their wares. Bindi-bindi Mia created native posies with the help of Jess' sister Felicity, from Stem and Stone. Moorditj Yonga Mia sold hand-made terrariums and ran mini terrarium workshops. Yokine Mia sold baked potatoes flavoured with herbs from our Tucker Bush garden, bath salts and salt bush. Students from Kaarla Mia ran individual stalls based on a class Inquiry into market stalls. Students researched, plan, budgeted and created a range of items sold on the day. including lemonade, rocky road, treat bags, hot chocolate, succulents, paper craft, jewellery and more. Our parent forum raised over \$1000.00 offering delicious treats, mouth-watering hotdogs and pumpkin soup, merchandise and of course a very successful raffle.









Our day commenced with a touching Welcome to Country and traditional smoking ceremony delivered by Aunty Marie Taylor. We were lucky to host Farmer Damien and his Moobile Animal Farm, many of our visitors enjoyed time spent patting and cuddling the animals! Educated by Nature were also set up in our Wilderness Area working with children and parents alike to build huts. Visitors enjoyed music by the very talented Esther Olden and jammed along with The Lost Cores.









It was a magical day enjoyed by all who attended. The feedback from visitors was glowing! I left full of pride for our school and community. A huge thank you to all the parents who helped make the day such a success. A massive shoutout to all the staff who put in many hours of work in the lead up to the event and on the day! ## **Community Jobs**

Each family is required to do 10 hours of community jobs in Term 3. Jobs come in a range of forms, and are specific tasks that each family takes on to help our school run smoothly, cooperatively, and fairly. In a larger school, many of these jobs are completed by paid contractors. In order to keep fees low and to foster a sense of belonging at Kerry Street, families are responsible for contributing skills, expertise, and time. Remember, you can always pay the levy if you are unable to participate, though taking on a job is a great way to get to know the school and to feel part of it.

Types of jobs include:

- school washing once a week
- sweeping/tidying the outside of the school (never ending!)
- join a committee for example marketing, Reconciliation Action Plan working group, event planning
- building / maintenance projects
- helping organise the school camp
- scholastic book order coordination
- · grant researching and writing
- graphic design
- shelving library books
- becoming a class rep
- gardening
- rubbish removal
- end of term/year clean up

## **Swimming**

Our first week of swimming has been a huge success! After a couple of sessions of working out which group is suitable for each child everything is under way and running well. A huge thank you to our amazing staff who have supported the transition into lessons and doing everything in their power to ensure things run smoothly, including stepping up and getting into the water to help out swimming instructors.

Unfortunately, Melville Kirby Swim has informed us that we are unable to use the changerooms following our sessions. Apparently, this was communicated to public schools who use the venue, we did not receive this information ahead of time. From today, students will towel dry themselves following their session and wrap their towels around them. They will get straight onto the bus after this. Fortunately, it's a quick turnaround from sessions finishing to our arrival back at school. Students can get changed once they return to school if they wish to do so.

I know this is not ideal, please know that I tried to request use of the changerooms for our whole swimming block. Parents are welcome to collect children from the venue before 2:50pm. If you choose to collect your child, please ensure you arrive before 2:50pm to give enough time to collect them and sign out before we start to count students for our return bus trip.

I will be feeding back the difficulties of not having access to changeroom facilities. Please also know that we have been allocated Cockburn ARC for swimming next year so we should not have this issue again.

## **School Promotional Video**

We are currently employing ways to promote our wonderful school, beautiful grounds and unique educational experience. On Tuesday the 13<sup>th</sup> September, we will have a film crew at the school from The Hybrid Minds who are creating two promotional videos for our school which will be used on our website and social media pages including Facebook, Instagram and LinkedIn. Filming will take place all day and will include drone footage of our grounds and Wilderness Area, interviews with staff, students, parents and board members, a virtual tour of the grounds with footage of students in the class as well as in play.

For your child to partake it is necessary to obtain your written permission by signature, which agrees to and understands the content. A talent release form will be sent home, which we require **all** families to complete. You can print off a copy of the form below or see Linda for a hardcopy. Please ensure you tick the appropriate box for your preference:

- I give permission for my child to be interviewed
- I give permission for my child's face to be in frame
- I wish for my child to remain unidentifiable within the shot
- I do not consent to my child being filmed

Please note that not all students with permission for interviews will be interviewed or in the final product.

An unidentifiable image includes visuals of the backs of students' heads, playing in groups where they are blocked by another student or object, or blurred images.

If you revoke consent completely, your child will join another class or be moved to another area whilst the filming occurs.

We are also looking for expressions of interest from parents who are willing to be interviewed about the family friendly aspect of our school. I am in the process of

writing questions/points of interest for the video now and am open to suggestions if you have any.




