


Message from Melissa

Welcome to 2023!

It was absolutely lovely welcoming all our students and families to school on Wednesday! There were feelings of excitement, nervousness and joy from both staff and students. We all enjoyed seeing the smiling faces as they walked through the gates and settled into classrooms.





The return to school is always very busy so this fortnight we have included some important information which will be handy for both new and returning families. More information can be found in our Parent Handbook via the link below.

Before and after school

Drop off and pick up location will remain the same as last year. Students can be dropped off at the Forrest Rd entrance and collected from the Kerry Street entrance, these are the areas that will be supervised during these times.

School times

School is from 8:45am – 3:15pm

In the mornings students will be supervised from 8:30am in the undercover area and backyard. We encourage students to arrive between 8:30-8:45am to allow them to get organised for the day and connect with peers. Before 8:30am there will be no teacher on duty. Please be mindful that staff often use this time to prepare for the day and are not available to supervise students.

If you are running late in the morning, please sign children in at the front office. We ask that parents sign in for children unless children are travelling to school independently.

In the afternoons we ask parents/ carers to be present to collect children at 3:15pm, from the playground area. There will be a duty teacher supervising this area until 3:30pm. After this time students will move to the undercover area / administration building. At our school re-registration visit last year it was noted that we should be actively supervising all entrances to the school grounds. As a result the gates to the playground area will only be accessible at school collection time, whilst the after school duty teacher is on duty. These gates will be locked following

this (usually between 3:30 – 3:40pm). Gates will be opened for Kindergarten collections on Mondays at lunch time.

If you are running late please let our administration team know. If you would like to give permission for another adult to collect your child/ren, please email kerrystreet@kerrystreet.wa.edu.au or phone administration on 9335 1471. All previous ongoing after school care arrangements have now been removed from the duty folder. If you would like to continue an arrangement from last year, please contact our administration team with details of this notification. If you are collecting a child on behalf of someone else, please notify the after school duty teacher.

Students need to bring to school each day:

- A hat essential for all outdoor play all year
- Closed in shoes compulsory for excursions and play in the Wilderness Space
- Water bottle
- Crunch & Sip fruit, vegetables, grains, or nuts (packed separately to lunch)
 which can be enjoyed during the morning session
- A change of clothes and towel we encourage water play, students must have the resources they need to get changed if they get wet

We recommend that all personal items are clearly labelled.

Sunscreen

Given the warmer weather this term **please make sure you have made arrangements for sunscreen at school**. If you would prefer you child does not use school sunscreen, please provide an alternative to your child's classroom teacher.

Dogs on Grounds

ALL dogs must be kept on a lead whilst on school grounds, regardless of their temperament. Some staff and/or students may have fears or anxiety regarding dogs, we ask our community to be understanding of this.

Friday Excursions

For Term 1 we will be taking part in gymnastics, this will take place at school. Please collect your child/ren from school at 3:15pm on Fridays. We will head to the park again in Term 2.



Wellbeing

Separation can be tricky

As we commence a new year many students find the return to school and/or transition to school challenging. At Kerry Street we are happy to help with this is a number of different ways. We can support a long term stepped approach, a short term transition and we also completely understand that for some of our parents/carers, we need to work towards quick goodbyes as you have other commitments.

If you are finding separation difficult, please make a time to meet with your child/ren's teacher. Together you can develop a plan to suit you and your family over this period. Some tips include:

- Decide how you plan to transition your child to school. We are open to supporting what you want/need in the mornings and have a wealth of experience and strategies for different models of separation. Once you have an idea of what you would like to do, make a time to discuss this with your child/ren's teacher and get their feedback.
- Work with the teacher to select a time to leave and stick to it. We know it can
 be distressing leaving an upset child! In our experience, most children calm
 down quickly and reconnect with the class and peers. Stretching out
 goodbyes often leads to increased anxiety for all involved and it is much
 harder for children to regulate after an extended goodbye.
- Trust that we will contact you if your child remains distressed. If your child is not able to regulate we will call and ask you to return. We also try to let you know if your child has settled to put your mind at ease.
- Develop a system with the teacher to indicate if you want us to step in and help with separation. We are often unsure if and when you want our support.
 Establishing a code word or sign ahead of time helps us to help you when you need it.
- Make time to build connections with other children outside of school. This
 often helps to build confidence and creates a feeling of safety for children
 parents aren't present.

We know separation can be really tough for all involved. Please be aware that we are here to help! If you have any further questions or need some support please don't hesitate to contact your child/ren's teacher.





 A chance to connect with other early years professionals and share ideas.


