
The What Matters? Writing competition is open to school students in years 5 to 12 from Australia. Responding to the simple question 'what matters?', entrants are free

to express their views on any matter they care about.

Part writing exercise, part civics and citizenship activity, What Matters? Is the perfect opportunity to empower students to raise their voices on issues that are important to them and know that their perspectives are valuable, regardless of age, background or viewpoint. Entries can be fiction, non-fiction, poetry or prose of up to 600 words and submitted online.

After a term of debating, persuading and even protesting, I believe our Year 5/6 students are ready to have their voices heard and share what they wish to change in this world or within our community! Students are currently working on submissions and these will be published and shared with the school community as well as being entered into the Whitlam Institute's What Matters? Writing Competition.

We are all excited to see pieces coming together and are looking forward to sharing our work!

th Apple By now you should have received an email with information about registering for Sentral. Sentral is a school management system which will allow us to integrate notifications, messaging, forms, and attendance, which will ensure seamless communication between parents and teachers.

All parents are required to register for individual accounts by Thursday the 4th of May 2023.

To set up Sentral on your devices:

- Please download the Sentral Parents application from the <u>Apple Store</u> or <u>Google Play</u>.
- 2. Search for Kerry Street Community School and click Register Now.
- 3. You must use a valid email address to create your username.
- 4. Once successfully registered you will receive a verification email.
- 5. Once verified, please log into your account using your email address and the password you created.
- 6. To see information from the school and to link to your enrolled children, enter the access key provided.

Please note that the access key is case sensitive so copy it into the box provided on screen, exactly as it appears in your email.

We appreciate that this is another process you need to complete however, we hope that once the system is up and running it will amalgamate many previously used communication channels and make it much easier for you to connect with the school.

Please don't hesitate to let us know if you need support using or accessing the Sentral app and please feel free to provide any feedback as we are all getting acquainted with the new system.

Bullying

Bullying is repeated verbal, physical, social or psychological behaviour that is harmful and involves the misuse of power by an individual or group towards one or more persons. It can be obvious or hidden (covert) and can have long-term effects on those involved.

Bullying can happen:

- face-to-face (e.g. pushing, tripping, name-calling)
- at a distance (e.g. spreading rumours, excluding someone)
- electronic communication (e.g. SMS, email, messenger, facebook and other social media).

Some conflicts between children are a normal part of growing up and are to be expected. These conflicts or fights between equals and single incidents are not considered bullying, even though they may be upsetting and need to be resolved. Identifying bullying can sometimes be difficult. Bullying is often conducted out of sight of teachers. Children are often reluctant to report bullying.

Bullying can be devastating for a person's confidence and self-esteem. Children and young people need lots of love and support if they are being bullied. They also need to know that action will be taken to prevent any further bullying.

Your Move

We are continuing to encourage students and their families to consider walking, riding, scooting and catching public transport to school in support of the <u>Your Move Schools</u> program.

We are aiming to decrease car pick ups and drop offs by 10% this year. Help us achieve our goal by walking, riding or scooting to school a few times each week. It's a small behavioural change that delivers huge benefits, including:

- Reduced congestion, travel times and parking problems around schools;
- Reduced carbon dioxide emissions around the school;
- Improved safety for everyone at drop off and pick up times;
- Lifelong improved health and emotional well-being due to instilling positive exercise habits at a young age;
- Improved concentration and academic performance;
- More sustainable and cost-effective transport outcomes, such as reducing the need for investment in parking that may only be utilised for a short period each day, and reduced road infrastructure maintenance costs.

Everyone can get involved in Your Move. Do you live too far away? Why not drive to a nearby park or café and then walk the rest of the way? Concerned about safety? Why not join your kids in walking or riding to school once a week? Small changes still make a big difference.
